Their knowledge and experiences beyond their immediate environment can be very limited but we have found if offer them just a glimpse into the wider world their curiosity and thirst for knowledge become a key driver for their learning.

Our Intent

"A high-quality geography education should inspire in pupils a curiosity and fascination about the world and its people that will remain with them for the rest of their lives"

The starting point for our curriculum development was thinking about what knowledge and experiences the children at Bredbury bring with them when they enter school and where we need to develop their knowledge of the world. We asked ourselves- What do our children really need to enable them to become good geographical learners. We also have a responsibility to show them the world and all the wonders of it. Good citizens of the world and care for their immediate and wider environment

From our experience, we know that we need to focus on developing the children's concept of their local area and introducing them to the wider world, initially of the UK and then very generally to the wider world. The curriculum is carefully planned to allow the introduction of key concepts, the building of these key concepts and allowing for regular revisits of key knowledge.

Other areas we know we need to focus on is developing our children's sense of Scale, within their immediate location and when it come to the wider world. We want our children be curious about the world they live and to ask and answer questions.

EYFS lay clear foundations for the golden threads od learning and the geography curriculum is carefully plotted into the EYFS overview and as the children move through school we aim

We expect that the study of Geography will equip our children with an understanding of places, people, resources and environments around them. Through a knowledge-rich curriculum, our pupils will be able to build on prior learning about physical and human processes and the formation and use of landscapes and environments. They will develop an understanding that the Earth's features are interconnected and change over time, and we will encourage an exploration of their own environment and challenge pupils to make connections between their local surroundings and that of contrasting settlements in different places in the world. Wherever, possible, we will use our local area and community to develop geographical skills and knowledge.

We aim for our children to think and work like geographers through carefully selected enquiry questions and fieldwork that build and extend the children's knowledge
