

## PE Grant Planned Expenditure: Report to Governors

PE funding (launched September 2013) is a government grant that is sent into all schools on an annual basis. Our actual allocation for 2016/17 is £9130

This money is allocated to improve the **quality and breadth of Physical Education, Healthy Active Lifestyles and Competitive School Sport.**

St. Mark's Primary School is committed to this agenda and is aiming to ensure that the funding is used to:

- support the quality of PE delivery – bearing in mind, sustainability
- support healthy active lifestyles
- support competitive school sport
